COURSE STRUCTURE

PART 1 MODULES & READINGS IN CLINICAL ETHICS

- Format: Online learning videos
- Approximately 4 hours

What will be covered:

- Methods and principles of clinical ethics
- Consent and mental capacity
- End of life
- Communication and documentation
- Other contextual concerns



PART 2 CASE-BASED INTERACTIVE WORKSHOP

2 half-day online sessions on 6 & 8 Dec 2021
(9.00am — 12.50pm)

- Format: Small group learning conducted via Zoom
- Class size is limited to 24 pax (Ratio of 1 trainer to 8 participants)

What will be covered:

- Refusal of treatment
- Professionalism
- Respecting patient preferences
- Nutritional care and the patient's best interests

- Participants will be assessed via case discussions and multiple choice questions
