ABOUT THE SPEAKERS



Alessandro Fiocchi, MD, is the Director of Allergy at the Pediatric Hospital Bambino Gesù, Rome, Vatican City. Dr. Fiocchi is an expert in the field of food allergy and has dedicated his research and clinical work to the care of children with asthma and allergic disease. Currently, he leads a research group focusing on food allergy, asthma, and specific immunotherapy. Dr. Fiocchi has founded and presides over the Italian Research Foundation for Allergy and Asthma in Childhood – *Allegria ONLUS*, a charity dedicated to clinical and research studies. He is chair of the Adverse Reactions to Foods Committee of the American College of Allergy, Asthma, and Immunology, and has been the chair of the Special Committee on Food Allergy of the World Allergy Organization (WAO) since 2008. Under his chairmanship, WAO published the DRACMA guidelines on cow's milk allergy in 2010 and the CUPPA position paper on the use of probiotics in pediatric allergy. As a leader of the WAO, Dr. Fiocchi also supported the GLAD-P (Guidelines for Allergy Prevention) project.



Rosan Meyer, PhD, RD, is a module leader for the Food Hypersensitivity Module and honorary senior lecturer in pediatrics at Imperial College London. She is a visiting professor at KU Leuven, Belgium and the chair of the European Section of the International Network for Diet and Allergy, secretary of the Allied Health and Primary Care Section of EAACI and member of several EAACI task forces on food allergy. Dr. Meyer was the principal research dietitian at Great Ormond Street Hospital for Children, leading a project on the impact of gastrointestinal food allergies on children and their families until 2015. She also worked with the allergy team at St. Thomas Hospital as a research dietitian until 2018. In addition to research, Dr. Meyer has a successful pediatric dietetic practice specializing in food allergy, feeding difficulties, and faltering growth in London. Dr. Meyer is widely published on various food allergy topics, feeding difficulties and is particularly interested in the association between growth and food allergy.
